## WHAT IS DICE?

DICE (**D**escribe, **I**ncinvestigate, **C**reate, **E**valuate) is an approach to assess and manage behavioral and psychological symptoms of dementia (BPSD).

WAI team members have trained Dementia Care Specialists throughout the state to work with caregivers on managing challenging behaviors by using this systematic method.
