ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE UPDATE CONFERENCE

Statement of Need

Every 65 seconds someone in the United States develops Alzheimer's disease. It is estimated that 5.8 million Americans age 65 and older are currently living with Alzheimer's dementia, with the number growing to 13.8 million Americans by 2050. Alzheimer's disease is the sixth-leading cause of death in the United States. As a result, there is a heightened need for researchers, healthcare professionals as well as policymakers to prevent and address the increasing prevalence of Alzheimer's disease and related dementia in an aging society. The goal of this conference is to improve the diagnostic and therapeutic capability of healthcare professionals who care for persons living with dementia and their caregivers.

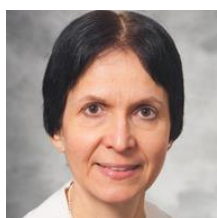

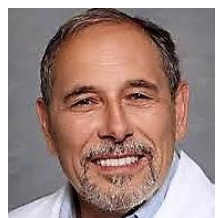

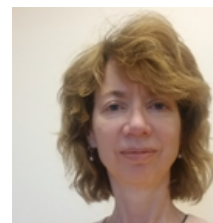
