Dr. Seeger is a clinical professor in the UW Department of Neurology. Her clinical interests include headache, dementia and autoimmune encephalitis. She heads one of the WAI-affiliated Memory Clinics in the Neurology Department. In addition to her clinical activities, she has been a Longitudinal Teacher Coach (LTC) at the Medical School, working with medical students on case-based learning and clinical skills training. Dr. Seeger is the Vice Chair for Clinical Operations and Quality Improvement in the Neurology department. She devotes additional time to peer review and quality improvement projects.

Dr. Art Walaszek is a board-certified geriatric psychiatrist and Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health. Dr. Walaszek is Vice Chair for Education and Faculty Development and Director of Psychiatry Residency Training. He is past president of the American Association of Directors of Psychiatric Residency Training (AADPRT). His research focuses on public health approaches to improving the care of people with dementia. Dr. Walaszek works with the Wisconsin Alzheimer's Disease Research Center, where he is Co-Leader of the Outreach, Recruitment and Education Core, and with the Wisconsin Alzheimer's Institute, where he leads the Public Health Pillar. Dr. Walaszek provides care to older adults with depression, anxiety, dementia and other mental health conditions, and teaches others to do the same.
