Statement of Need

It is estimated 6.7 million Americans age 65 and older are currently living with Alzheimer's dementia, and an additional 5-7 million of older Americans may have mild cognitive impairment due to Alzheimer's disease. It is anticipated the aging baby-boom generation will bring the estimate to 13.8 Americans age 65 and older living with Alzheimer's dementia by 2060. Alzheimer's disease is the seventh-leading cause of death in the United States. As a result, there is a heightened need for researchers, healthcare professionals and policymakers to prevent and address the increasing prevalence of Alzheimer's disease and related dementia in an aging society. The goal of this conference is to improve the diagnostic and therapeutic capability of healthcare professionals who care for persons living with dementia and their caregivers.
