Since 1998, the Wisconsin Alzheimer's Institute (WAI) has been a transformational leader in Alzheimer's disease research, community engagement and public health programs.

Through research initiatives, statewide memory clinic development, education, and community programs, we identify and provide strategies to reduce dementia risk and offer access to effective care. WAI scientists and program leaders coordinate research-based education and programs for community members throughout Wisconsin and across the nation.

In 2008, we established the WAI Regional Milwaukee Office, furthering our goals of empowering the local community, improving access to quality care, and building more equitable research and services.

WAI is committed to health equity and improving the quality of life of people living with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia and their families.

OUR PROGRAMS

Health Equity

The WAI Regional Milwaukee Office helms our health equity programs and is a national leader in building culturally-tailored programs to improve access to diagnosis and resources, and increase awareness and engagement in communities of color.

Research

With its academic home within WAI, the Wisconsin Registry for Alzheimer's Prevention (WRAP) is one of the largest and longest-running family history studies of Alzheimer's disease in the world.

Clinical Care

The WAI Dementia Diagnostic Clinic Network is a collaboration of memory clinics in 21 Wisconsin counties working to improve access and clinical care; ensuring quality diagnosis and care is available in every corner of the state.

Education

WAI offers education for health care professionals to learn updates in the diagnosis and management of dementia. Professionals, students and family caregivers receive education and resources through programs, professional trainings and internships.

Community Engagement

To increase support of Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, WAI works with community partners to disseminate to both clinicians and caregivers strategies to reduce dementia risk; improving access to quality care services and effective models of care.
